Go take a hike... To Holland Falls



This is the best time of the year to hike to any of the waterfalls in the area. Because of the spring run-off, there is more water going over the falls, which makes for an awesome sight!

The hike to Holland Falls is one of our favorites. This well maintained National Recreation trail follows the north shoreline of Holland Lake for about 1 mile, and then leads up the mountain for last 1/2 mile to the falls. The view of the Mission Mountains over Holland Lake from the end of the trail rivals the beauty of the waterfall itself. This is a moderately easy hike for the whole family. **To get there:** From the resort, take a left onto the highway. 18 miles north, take a right onto Holland Lake Road. The road ends at the trailhead about 4 miles from the highway.

Learn a bit about White-tailed Deer



Size: 4 to 6 feet long; tail: 7 to 11 inches;

height: 2 3/4 to 3 1/2 feet

What to look for: tail white on underside,

raised when alarmed, antlers (males) have several prongs; fur reddish in summer and grayish-brown in winter

Habitat: forests, swamps, brushy areas

Wildflower of the week



Bunchberry

Size: 1 to 12 inches tall; flower 3/4 to 1 1/2 inches wide

Habitat: rich woods, thickets, bogs

What to look for: flower heads made of tight greenish clusters of flowers and 4 white petal-like bracts; whorl of leaves below flower head; fruits red, berry like, clustered

In bloom: May through July
