WILDLIFE VIEWING BLIND

An easy 1 ½ mile walk right from the resort takes you to a viewing blind that overlooks the Clearwater River wetlands at the north end of Seeley Lake. This blind, built and maintained by the Seeley Lake Ranger District, is a great place to view wildlife that visit, feed, and/or nest in this secluded area. Moose, deer, mountain lion, beaver, blue heron, river otter and loons are among the many animals that you may see on this hike. To get there, follow the trail to the ranger station at the top of our road. At the ranger station, follow the arrows down near the lake.

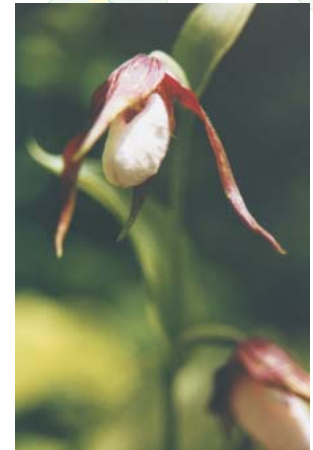


Learn a bit about Bluebird



Size: 6 to 7 inches long
What to look for: male: sky blue above, light blue below; female: mostly gray, with some blue; immature: grayer, with streaked underparts
Habitat: open high-elevation areas with scattered trees and brush; sometimes in lowlands

Wildflower of the week



Mountain Lady's Slipper

Size: 10 to 28 inches tall; flower 2 to 4 inches wide

Habitat: open woods, slopes

What to look for: flowers with white slipper-like lip and purplish spiral side petals, 1 to 3 borne near top of stem; leaves clasping stem.

In bloom: May through July
